

MAKING GOOD CHOICES: SELECTING THE CORRECT REPERTOIRE FOR YOUR BEGINNING OR YOUNG JAZZ ENSEMBLE

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KNOWING YOUR ENSEMBLE

- Know your section leaders and section players strengths & what is in progress
- Know your brass ranges, especially lead players
- Know ability level and comfort level of all rhythm section players. Are players comfortable with:
 - Alternate notation
 - Comping
 - Reading chord changes
 - Bass: 1/2 position
 - Drums: basic grooves; basic drum set notation
- Know who is interested in improvising/soloing

PERSONALIZE CRITERIA FOR LITERATURE SELECTION

- Keep the strengths of the ensemble in mind
- Engaging/fun to play
- Making Connections with Jazz History
- Begin with the end in mind!
 - Scaffold the charts
 - Build confidence by starting with very easy selections that use block scoring and/or call response
 - Don't be afraid to change direction if the chart is not working....it's not working
 - Have back up charts to go to just in case!

CHARACTERISTICS OF QUALITY BEGINNING AND YOUNG JAZZ ENSEMBLE LITERATURE

- Easy to read
- Articulations are clear and consistent
- There are repetitious elements (melodies, rhythm section parts) builds confidence!!
- Room For Solos/Guide Solos
- Improvisation Sections have Limited Harmonic Palettes
- Rhythm Section parts are carefully notated
 - Guitar parts have limited technical demands
 - Piano voicings are age level appropriate
 - Bass lines/figures are repetitious & attainable
 - Drum parts are easy to decode (or to explain)

EVALUATION OF LITERATURE CHOICES

- Is this chart working?
 - YES > GREAT!!
 - NO> WHY?
 - Big picture issues
 - Not buying in
 - Too difficult for too many players and/or key players.....at that moment
 - Smaller issues can they be solved?
